Role Play Script

Scenario 1

Setting	People	Script
Classroom	Small Group- 2 students	Student 1: *Turns to student 2 & hands them a pencil* Student 2: *Looks at student 1* Student 1: "I think you dropped this." Student 2: "Oh yeah, it was in my backpack-thanks!"

Scenario 2

Setting	People	Script
Hallway	Several students/staff walking by	Student 1, 2 & 3: *Walking as a group, next to each other, down the hallway* Student 4: *Attempts to walk by group of students 1,2 & 3* Student 4: "Can I squeeze through? Gotta get to class." Students 1, 2 & 3: "Whoops! We are taking up a lot of room in the hall."

Scenario 3

Setting	People	Script
Lunchroom	Student & Staff member	Staff: "How's the pizza today?" Student 1: *Taking a drink from her bottle, sets bottle on table" Student 1: "Pretty...*burps*" Student 1: "Excuse me, I meant to say pretty good." Staff: "No problem-I should have waited to ask until you were done drinking."

Scenario 4

Setting	People	Script
Classroom	Student & Teacher	Teacher: "Dylan I am so proud of you, check out your score on the latest reading test!" Student 1: *Looks at score on teacher's computer screen* Student 1: "Nice! Better than I expected. I appreciate you telling me." Teacher: "You're welcome, keep up your hard work."



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Scenario 5

Setting	People	Script
Outside- before school	Small Group- 3 students	Student 1: *Looks at student 3* Student 1: "I love your new shoes!" Student 2: "Me too!" Student 3: "Thank you, I saved money from my birthday & chores to buy them. Glad to know they were worth it!"

Other Possible Scenarios

1. Someone holds a door open for you (thank you)
2. Trying to gain someone's attention (excuse me)
3. Someone moves out of the way when you are walking fast (thank you)
4. A peer repeats the directions because you didn't hear them the first time (thank you)
5. A friend saves you a seat at the assembly (thank you)
6. A staff gives the class a treat for completing state testing (thank you)
7. Join in a conversation when a topic interests you (excuse me)
8. Joining in a conversation when you hear your name mentioned (excuse me)
9. Someone is sitting in your assigned seat in class (excuse me)
10. The librarian ordered a book you requested for your English class self-selected book report (thank you)
